New Toowoomba Hospital Façade

Artwork Opportunity

Health Infrastructure Queensland and Darling Downs Health are seeking registrations of interest from First Nations artists who would like to be considered for the commissioning process of an artwork design which will be integrated within the external façade of the new Hospital in Toowoomba.

Project Context

This significant opportunity is part of the Queensland Government's \$18.5 billion Hospital Rescue Plan, which is delivering new and expanded healthcare services across the state. The New Toowoomba Hospital, located on the scenic Baillie Henderson campus, will provide world-class care to meet the needs of the region's growing population.

The vision for the Baillie Henderson Hospital campus will be a world-class health and knowledge precinct, centred around the New Toowoomba Hospital. The strikingly beautiful 75-hectare campus includes tree-lined spaces interconnected between heritage buildings, multidisciplinary health services, research, education, commercial, and community recreation spaces.

When completed the New Toowoomba Hospital will deliver new and expanded health care services to the region to cater to its growing population.

The New Toowoomba Hospital Arts in Health Program will reflect a contemporary healthcare vision and communicate to consumers, staff and the community that the hospital is forward facing while honouring the legacies and histories of the past, including a commitment to health equity across the Darling Downs region.

Artwork Opportunity

Artists shortlisted for this opportunity will be invited to provide concepts for an artwork which is to be integrated into the building façade. This will be one of the major artwork commissions for the project, widely seen on approach to the hospital and visible from within the building.

As the artwork will be embedded within the skin of the building, the production of the artwork will involve close collaboration between the artist and the design and construction teams and will be supported by Arts in Health specialists.

Process

Following the closure of the ROI, a shortlist of artists will be developed to move into Concept Design phase otherwise known as the RFO (Request for Offer). Their concepts will then be evaluated using a formal selection process and a preferred artist will be appointed and contracted. Shortlisted artists will be paid a design fee on delivery of the concept.

Eligibility

Please note that Queensland Health staff members are not eligible for consideration for this project.

Eligibility to be shortlisted will be determined by the following factors:

Experience:

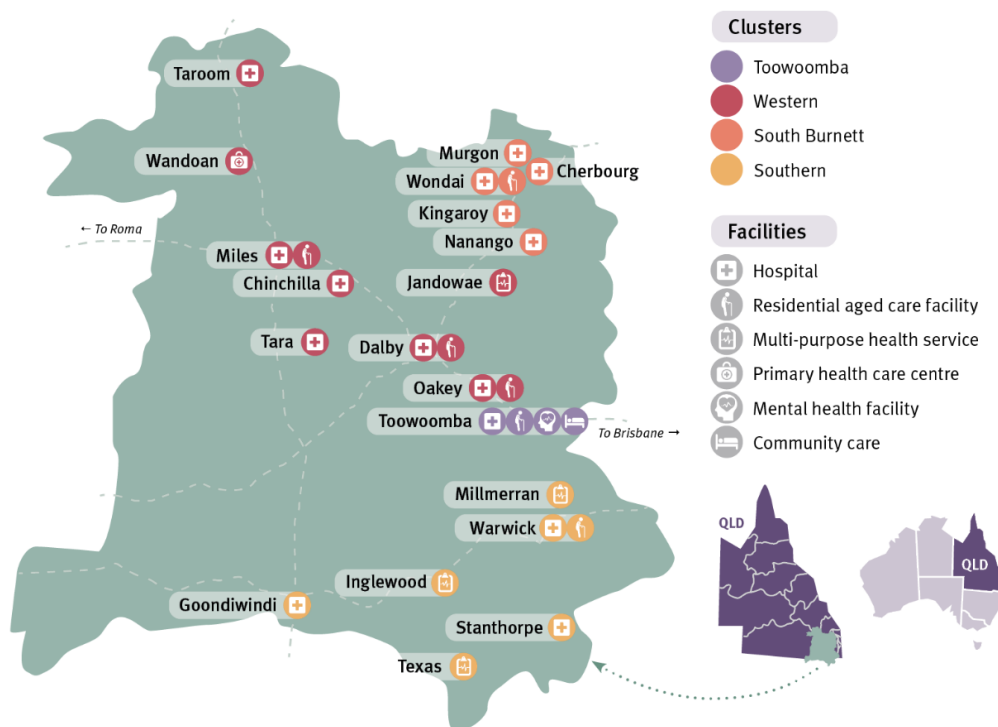
Artists who have had experience collaborating with multi-disciplinary teams on artworks integrated into building design are particularly invited to register interest. The artwork deliverable will be a digital file in a format specified for production using a specific manufacturing process.

Availability:

Due to the program timeline, artists who register interest should, if shortlisted, have availability to work on a concept design over the next two months, and if selected as preferred artist, on the detailed design for delivery in mid-November.

Connection:

First Nations artists with connections to the Darling Downs region are invited to register their interest in participating in this opportunity by providing their details following the process outlined below. Connections to the region may include familial ties, current or former residency, or heritage relationships with Traditional Owner groups throughout the catchment (see map below).



ROI Requirements

It is important to note that we are not asking artists to submit ideas or concepts at this stage. Shortlisted artists will eventually be provided with a thorough brief which they will use to develop a concept.

To be considered for this opportunity, please provide the following:

- A short biographical statement outlining your connection to the Darling Downs Health region (no more than 100 words)
- A concise CV – up to 2 pages outlining previous experience, contact details including name and address, phone number, email address, ABN, education history, exhibitions, projects, website/portfolio/social media links.
- Up to five images of previous artworks relevant to this opportunity
- Answer the below Domestic and Family Violence Policy questionnaire, Ethical Supplier Threshold and sign.
